

# SUDes - Degree Project Presentation

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To satisfy the requirements of the Degree of Master of Science in Architecture, with specialisation in Sustainable Urban Design, the student must complete an independent study (degree project) of at least 30 higher education credits. The degree projects must be presented at one of the two scheduled presentations each year. The presentation sessions take place at School of Architecture in LTH and follow the procedure described below.

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| <b>Examiner</b>               | It is the responsibility of the examiner to assess and grade all aspects of the degree project. The examiner's role at the presentation session is therefore to listen to the presentation and to discuss the project with the student and members of the jury.   |
| <b>Jury</b>                   | The degree project is to be presented before a jury of at least two persons. The jury has an advisory function. Members of the jury discuss the project with the student and the examiner and provide feedback on the strengths and weaknesses in the proposal and possible areas for improvement. Jury members often take part in several presentation sessions which provides for equal assessment.   |
| <b>Moderator</b>              | A moderator keeps track of time and determines that relevant procedures and regulations are adhered to during the presentation session. It can be the examiner or another faculty member of Sustainable Urban Design at School of Architecture, LTH.  |
| <b>Presentation Procedure</b> | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Welcome and introduction. The moderator welcomes the audience to the degree project presentation and introduces the student, the jury, the examiner and the supervisor <b>(5 minutes)</b>.</li> <li>2. Project presentation. The student presents his/her project with the help of power point, posters and, in case, a model <b>(20 minutes)</b>.</li> <li>3. Critique and discussion. The jury and the examiner are invited to ask for clarifications and to discuss and comment on the project <b>(30 minutes)</b>.</li> <li>4. Questions and comments. The audience is invited to ask questions and/or comment on the project.</li> <li>5. The session is closed by the moderator after which the jury, examiner and supervisor retire to the conference room for deliberation <b>(15 minutes)</b>.</li> <li>6. The jury returns and the examiner announce the result of the review and the recommendations from the jury.</li> </ol> |
